ABDALLAH AKAR

Born in Tunisia and moved to France in the late 1960's to pursue his studies in science at Paris VII University. In 1980 he met and trained under the master Ghani Alani, Akar has worked on the art of calligraphy for nearly thirty years and has taught at the 'Institute du Monde Arabe' since 1993. As a painter and calligrapher, Akar draws his inspiration from Arabic and Western poetry (Mahmoud Darwish, Omar Al Khayyam), using a luminous palette with a balanced mix of writing and colour, on materials as diverse as textile, wood and iron, iron Akar exhibited for the first time in 1986. Since his first exhibition he has been exhibited in Europe and the Middle East in several solo and group presentations. During the early 2000, he realized a powerful installation of 16 textiles richly decorated with calligraphy, a tribute to Pre-Islamic poetry, which he followed in 2007 with a publication of Po'mes Suspendus (Muallag'at), edited in both French and Arabic languages, (cf. Editions Alternatives, Paris)







ANWAR AL HALAWANI

AlHalawani was born in Aleppo, Syria in 1967. He finished his initial schooling in the schools of Aleppo before he joined the College of Fine Arts where he majored in engraving and graphics and graduated with a Very Good rating. His passion for calligraphy started even before high school, receiving support and encouragement from his father who was a teacher of Arabic in the schools of Aleppo. In high school this passion found its expression by writing on the then available Calligraphy Handbooks, notably that of the late calligrapher Hashem Mohamed Al-Baghdadi. During his high school years, he met the calligrapher Abdelkarim Darwish, from whom he learnt the principles of Rugaa, Diwani and Farsi scripts. He taught calligraphy in the schools of Riyadh, KSA between 2000 and 2005. During a visit to Medina, KSA, he met with the master calligrapher Othman Taha, the scribe of the Holy Quran. When he showed him his works. Othman Taha admired them and granted him, in 2004, the Ijaza in Thuluth and Naskh scripts in recognition of his good talent. He has bagged several local, Pan-Arab and international awards. He took part in writing Al-Sham Holy Quran, the world's biggest version, in 2006. He is the author of Landmarks of the Thuluth Script, a book that was published in Aleppo in 2007. Currently, he is a lecturer of Arabic calligraphy in the Fine Arts College, Aleppo University.



Later, he acquired a License in the Kufic calligraphy versions from the head of Egyptian calligraphers, Master Khudayr al-Bursaidi. Furthermore, Ashraf received a license in the Kufic calligraphy versions from Iraqi calligraphy master Yusuf al-Sammak. Ashraf was also a Kufi calligraphy apprentice of three masters of the art: Isam Abd-al-Fattah, distinguished Syrian calligraphy artist Munir al-Sha'rani, as well as the renowned grand artist Muhammad Munir al-Rabbat. The three had been taught by the former head of Egyptian calligraphers, Muhammad Abd-al-Qadir. Today Ashraf is a member of the Egyptian General Assembly of Arabic Calligraphy, and of the General Egyptian Association of Arabic Calligraphy. Additionally, he is an honorary member of the Center for Pioneers of Plastic Art in Egypt.



EVERITTE BARBEE

American Arabic calligrapher and visual artist based in Beirut since 2011. His work is derived entirely from the Diwani and Jali Diwani scripts of Islamic calligraphy. The texts are often flexibly arranged to create complex figural images, breaking the traditional rules of the script where necessary to illustrate images or symbols. His evolving body of work as a whole attempts follow the traditional rules of the scripts increasingly stringently while maintaining or increasing figural clarity of the images. Thematically the subject matter of Everitte's work ranges widely from American propaganda and pop culture to human rights, classical Arabic poetry, and religious texts. Born and raised in Nashville, Tennessee, Everitte began practicing Islamic calligraphy while studying in Damascus, Syria in 2009. He continues his studies in calligraphy both in Lebanon and Istanbul. His work has been exhibited in solo and group shows in more than two dozen countries across Europe and the MENA region.





Syrian visual artist who is devoted to artistic work. He has many artistic projects, ranging from realism and impressionism to calligraphy. Calligraphy was one of the most important projects he presented, and he has a rich past in this field. In his work, we see letters coming together, dancing, and standing out between love and rejection, between the possible and the impossible, between dreams and reality. Hadi takes his colors through his Sufi dimensions, soaring in the space of his artistic talent, marked by his Eastern expressions in the spontaneous fabric of his colorful decorations that carve out calligraphic grooves in the field of his expressive calligraphic painting, reflecting his worlds and themes in a coherent abstract atmosphere with the components of Arabic letters. The viewer's sense of art merges with his artistic sense, depriving him of his vision without giving him the opportunity to step out of the frame of the painting. Hadi Qassous was able to tame Arabic letters as a beauty term that goes beyond the traditional classic painting of Arabic calligraphy to a state of creativity, freedom, and refined art on the scale of expressive visual art. Here, Hadi turned the written text into a beautiful visual expressive text, leaving his clear marks on his artistic painting.



IBRAHEEM KHAMAYSEH




KHALID SHAHIN



He shows extraordinary skills using his hand freely and spontaneously to reflect a deep love for the Arabic language, its culture and letters.

In addition to being an artist, AI Zahawi is an architect and entrepreneur who has worked extensively in the Middle East and North Africa since 2001. He draws his inspiration from the natural contradictions of gain and loss, triumph and defeat, cultural diversity and struggles, each of which gives meaning to the recipient. All this is reflected in his artwork, in which he sheds light on the stark contradictions that we live in every day. He harnesses the power of black and white to embody the dilemma of extremes, from hope and despair to life and death
